Discussion Question: What three measures do you want Partners to consider for implementing value based contracting?

Breakout Session Responses:

MHSU Providers-Group 1

1. Engagement in services in any facility seven days post discharge from hospitalization
2. No increase in care or institutionalization for three months while in care
3. Increased pro-social behaviors that impact community wellness as define by employment, community activities, and education

MHSU Providers-Group 2

1. List specific social determinants of health and require providers to select a certain predetermined number of them, to show improvement in clients (allows flexibility for various types of service provision)
2. During episode of care, 40% of clients will maintain the least restrictive living/residential environment
3. 40% of MH discharges from the hospital or SU discharges from detox/FBC will have paid claims within seven days of discharge

Caveats:

- No increase in burden on providers when measuring and reporting outcomes
- Regarding #3, hold hospitals accountable for scheduling discharge appointments within x number of days prior to discharge
- Understand that expectations need to evolve over time

IDD Providers-Group 1

1. Attending physical every year
2. Increase in community integrated outcomes as evidenced by survey, increased use of services such as Community Networking, Supported Employment (this can also be captured as a percentage based on the number of outings completed)
3. Increase in the continuity of care as evidenced by utilizing 90 % of service units already authorized. (this will also decrease the number of incident reports submitted due to failure to provide backup staffing)

IDD Providers-Group 2

1. Highest level of accreditation and survey results
2. Clients must have a primary care visit within the past 12 months
3. Home & Community Based Services (HCBS) Compliance

Hospital Providers Group

1. Timely follow-up within seven days after discharge, including discharge paperwork going to ambulatory care provider
2. Recidivism or rapid readmission within 30 days (hospital specific versus Partners' global)
3. Average length of stay
4. Metabolic screening (A1C)
5. Screening for alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs
